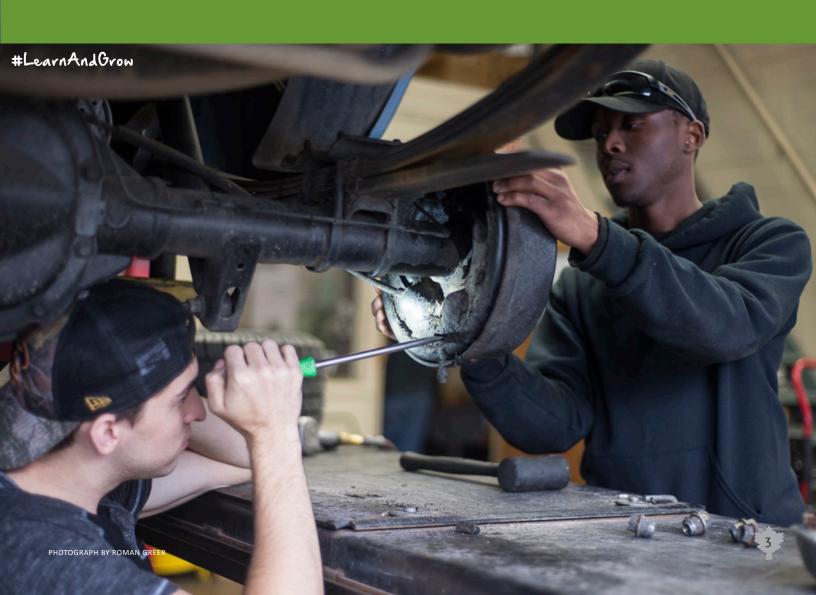

About this Plan

Vision 2025 was developed over a six-month process in collaboration with students, employees, Board members, and community leaders. After a series of surveys with students, employees, and community members, a few things were clear. First, MTCC's Mission, Vision, and Values needed a fresh look to help accelerate the college's progress into the future. Second, MTCC students and employees were eager to collaborate and engage to provide input about McDowell Tech's future.

After a dozen internal employee focus groups and numerous external engagements with community partners, a Planning Team was established representing all areas and divisions of the college. The Planning Team engaged with experts from the Belk Center for Community College Leadership & Research to discuss evidenced-based strategies related to college access, retention, and success. Four working groups were established who conducted an intensified review of MTCC data and developed objectives for the identified institutional goals. A series of student focus groups also took place to discuss values and traits of employees that contributed to student success at MTCC. The college's revised Mission Statement was the product of a student project in the Health Information Technology (HIT) Department. HIT students analyzed the results of the employee focus groups and presented their findings to the administration as a final class project.

The Vision 2025 strategic plan was presented to the Board of Trustees and approved in June 2021. As a result, the college is charged to **Learn and Grow** by mapping out strategies to achieve the identified goals and objectives prior to the year 2025!
